Why in July? This is the time of year that stores have sales on school supplies and are stocking shelves in preparation for upcoming holiday seasons. Look for bargains!! 
WEDNESDAY NIGHTS

The reason behind this decision is based on research in advertising and the media environment that indicates that nameless logos can evoke more personal and immediate reactions. This is important in a world where we are bombarded with images and plenty of possible distractions and diversions. "Researchers have demonstrated that the use of visual imagery (vs. verbal imagery) in advertising increases consumers' attention and challenges

them to interpret and understand the ad's message in a more active manner than words do," wrote Jill J. Avery, a senior lecturer at Harvard Business School, in an email. "This process of interpretation or 'elaboration' produces a higher quantity of mental images and, in many cases, a more personalized understanding of the ad's message." (Mattila, K. O.
